Success Criteria for Rich Task

Success Criteria for Rich Task/Prompt: Language

- The task asks my students to think hard (question, synthesize and evaluate)
- The task is connected to the curriculum
- The task is engaging and has meaning to my students
- The task is open-ended (no one right answer)
- All students can be successful in responding to the task
- Students can apply their learning in a variety of ways.

Success Criteria for Rich Task: Mathematics

- The problem is related to a big idea and supports conceptual rather than procedural understanding
- The solution is not immediately obvious
- The context is meaningful to the students
- The problem promotes the use of one or more strategies (see problem solving strategies and use of manipulatives)
- Decision making beyond simply choosing a mathematical operation is required
- The solution time is reasonable
- The situation may encourage collaboration
- Students are required to justify and or explain their thinking.
